

Pastor's Letter

Dear Members of our St. James Family,

I want to share with you that in October I submitted to Archbishop Gomez my desire to retire from active administration of a parish. He has accepted my request and I will be retiring as Pastor of St James, effective July 1. 2024.

The policy of the Archdiocese states that the normal age of retirement for priests is 70 and a priest must submit his retirement at age 75. I will be 73 next July when I retire. I am hoping to reside in another parish in the San Pedro Region where I could continue to assist with pastoral ministry rather than administration.

Originally I was expecting that the development of the new Parish Center would be completed by 2025 and I would stay to complete the project. With COVID, the long time in negotiating the sale of our property, the 2-year escrow, the focus now with trying to move the Preschool over to the school campus and the real prospect that the Parish Center project will likely take longer than hoped, the timeline is being pushed out much further than what I can do.

It is important then to get a new pastor here who would be able to be part of the planning and would be able to carry out the entire project to completion and beyond.

The transition won't happen for another 7 months, and we still have a lot of work to do on the preschool project and starting the plans for the new Parish Center. We have been through a lot in the last 12 years but our bond of faith has strengthened us and continues to guide us. What we have started here is one of the important blessings for the future of St. James. I have been tremendously blessed by the opportunity to serve here as Pastor during these past 13 years.



Topic: Witness to Faith

At an early Friday morning Mass as we were, "in communion," with the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Monsignor Mike talked about Mary as a key "connector" to our faith. That spiritual and liturgical theme of guiding and intercessory faith is scripturally evident across the ages.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church writes about the saintly example of Mary and the Church's "communion of saints." It is also written that: "Catholics venerate the saints and look to them as examples of lives well lived in the faith. Many find comfort in the knowledge that holy people shared in their same struggles, sins, doubts, or hardships and ask specific saints to pray for them."

Q: Who are some, among the litany of saints, prominent amid the seasons of Advent and Christmas?

A: Saint Francis- Seeking to make the story of the Holy Family more accessible to everyone, he began the tradition of the Creche, (from Latin *cripia*, crib, cradle); a model or moveable tableau; a Nativity scene arranged to represent the birth of Jesus, displayed in homes, churches, and other public places.

St. Bonaventure - wrote in a biography of St. Francis about the early Christmases of the 13th century and the Nativity scenes. People were moved spiritually to sing psalms of praise, These "sonorus" songs are credited with starting the tradition of caroling.

St. Lucia - whose very name means "light" is credited with a Scandinavian tradition of an Advent festival of lights.

St. Andrew - As another Advent tradition, the novena of his feast day honors God and the Blessed Mother.

St. Teresa of Avila - wrote a beautiful prayer of preparation for Advent, "I want to keep Advent in my soul..."

St. Nicholas - Probably a bishop in the 4th century, now traditionally associated with the festival of Christmas.

Here follow just a few of the saints from whom we draw upon for guiding faith principles at Advent and Christmas: The Feast of the Immaculate Conception Dec. 8th, The Feast of Juan Diego Dec. 9th, Our Lady of Guadalupe Dec. 12th, St. Lucy's Day Dec. 13th, St. John of the Cross, Dec. 14th and St. Ambrose, Dec. 7th. He is credited with Ambrosian chant, also known as Antiphonal chant. It is said that he wrote the hymn "Te Deum" when he baptized Augustine of Hippo.

Upon another midnight clear with anticipation and adoration, the connective power of the saints helps to uplift, enrich and guide the faithful to holiness.

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

Why do we believe in Jesus and the Catholic Church? Why should we continue to do so?

We've never seen him face-to-face (at least not most of us, I assume). Most of us have never had mystical visions of angels or saints. We live in the same world as our atheist and secularists friends.

Why do we believe in Christ if we've never seen him?

The simple, symbolic answer the Gospel presents to us this week might surprise us: we believe because of John the Baptist. Early in John's Gospel we hear: "There was a man sent from God, his name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him." The Baptist powerfully announces Jesus. This is a historical fact, and it is also now a pattern at work in our lives.

John the Baptist stands for the entirety of the old covenant, everything entrusted to the Jewish people. And yet he prophetically opens the door to something entirely new in Jesus, to the revival and fulfillment of God's promises. In every generation, and in every human life, God continues to do this. He has done it through people named Augustine, Francis, Catherine, Theresa, and countless others. In my life, the Baptist's spirit has come through persons named Eric, Paul, Mary, and Ron. I challenge you to name at least three people through whom God has announced the coming of Jesus in your life. Consciously thank God for their testimony. And let's commit ourselves to listening to the spirit of John the Baptist testify again this week so that we might more strongly believe in the light.


