

Dear Friends and Families of St. James,

Join us as we welcome Fr. Chibuike (Chi-Be-Kay) Nkemakolam Okeagu to St. James!



"I was born on March 24, 1981, in Orlu, Nigeria. I am the fifth child and fourth boy in a family of six – two girls and four boys.

After my high school, I joined the seminary. I obtained my Bachelors in Philosophy in 2007 at St. Joseph Major

Seminary, Ikot Ekpene, and obtained my Bachelors in Theology at Seat of Wisdom Seminary, Owerri, in 2012. I was retained to work in the

senior seminary, Seat of Wisdom Seminary, for one year at the request of the Rector and with the permission of my bishop and the bishops of the province.

I was ordained a deacon in April, 2013 and ordained a priest on September 26, 2013, at Immaculate Conception Cathedral, Okigwe by Bishop Solomon Amatu, the Bishop of Okigwe.

Within the ten years of my priestly ministry, I have served as an associate pastor, supply pastor, university chaplain in my home diocese and in North America. I also served as diocesan pastoral council secretary, personal secretary to my bishop, and Chancellor of the Diocese of Okigwe.

Currently, I am a Graduate student of Theology & Pastoral Theology at Loyola Marymount University.

I love reading, listening to music, playing soccer, watching football, meeting people and going places. My priestly ministry is my life and I love it. I am so grateful to Msgr. Meyers and Fr. Thaddeus and the community at St. James for welcoming me here in residence as I continue my studies."

Topic: With Angelic Hosts Proclaim

At a Christmas Eve Mass the prayers of petition were prefaced by the beautiful, spoken words:

"The Lord of truth is listening."

Q: Along with these humble pleadings of supplication, how else does the Mass offer opportunities for reverent, heartfelt expressions of entreaty, praise and adoration throughout the year to the God that became a child?

A: The expressive art of liturgical music is offered to a listening Lord and his faithful parishioners. St. James is blessed with the talent, vision, and dedication of Music Ministry Director Kevin Babuder, accompanist Dave Champagne, and cantors and choir members whose treasure of talent and time serve to enhance and enrich the liturgical experience throughout the year.

Pope Francis, speaking at the Vatican honoring St. Cecilia who is the Patron Saint, (or Patroness) of Music expressed esteem for and encouraged those who serve the liturgy through sacred music and singing, saying:

"...thev help the faithful feel attracted to beauty. elevating themselves to God and uniting hearts in praise and tenderness. I recommend that you help the whole people of God sing with conscious and active participation in the liturgy."

The *Catechism* talks, in Paragraph #1156, about the significance and "inestimable value" of the musical tradition of the universal Church:

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

A stranger in a foreign land, I was exhausted and homesick as my summer Spanish immersion ended in Guatemala. The rusty minivan arriving outside my small residence filled me with joyful hope. I was flying home to the U.S. and would be, at long last, completely happy. Or so I thought. After about half an hour of being home, I thought to myself, "This place is boring. I want to go somewhere." So, I hopped in my car and left to see my friends. As I drove, I wistfully wondered, "Where am I truly at home?"

The feast of Epiphany has a lot to do with our notion of home. Where is our origin? Where are we going? When is our wandering done? Saint Matthew tells us of the Magi, "They were overjoyed at seeing the star." This star will bring them home, to a place where their questing will end, and they will be satisfied. Their real home is neither in the East nor in the earthly Jerusalem. Somehow, their home is wherever this boy and his parents are.

If you're a teenager or older, you probably know by now that every physical home we have is temporary. So, we look up at the countless stars in our proverbial skies: things which bedazzle and beckon us to follow toward peace. The Gospel invites us to behold that — at long last — God has sent us a star to follow home, one that whispers, "Follow me! I will take you home!" Perhaps that star is your spouse. A friend. An opportunity. A cause. An intuition about a new direction. A prayer group. What is it for you? How will you know? It will lead you to Mary and Joseph and their son, and you will be home.
