





Topic: A Time to Seek

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops reports that Pope Francis once asked the faithful to:

"...be modern prophets by guiding others...
a prophet is someone who shows Jesus to others..."

Offering his own modern style of Christian guidance, Matthew Kelly gives parishioners at St. James, (by way of the largesse of Monsignor Mike in this season of giving), a book called *The Rocking Chair Prophet*. Kelly is an author, "thought leader," and disciple of the "best version of yourself" paradigm that offers this particular model in the form of a novel. Britannica Encyclopedia defines a novel as

- "...a prose narrative of significant complexity that deals imaginatively with human experience."
- **Q:** What is this significant, prosaic, complex human experience narrative *The Rocking Chair Prophet* about?
- A: Following a family tragedy, a man embarks on subsequent paths of isolation, meditative growth, exploration, and enlightenment.

It's a highly readable short novel about self-knowledge, emotion, and an articulation of personal and communal *potential*, culminating in what Kelly calls:

"...the Divine Spirit within you."

The Catechism Of The Catholic Church in Part One Section One, Chapter 2 teaches that the prophets:

"...proclaim a radical redemption of the people of God ...a salvation..."

Interestingly, too, amid the often mysterious realm of the prophets, there is literature that comes from both spiritual and secular sources.

For example, in an academic slave-to-freedom Pulitzer Prize biography of 19th century reformer *Frederick Douglass* by Yale Historian David W. Blight, the articulate Douglass wrote about his redemptive motives:

"There is a prophet within us, forever whispering that behind the **seen** lies the immeasurable **unseen**."

Kelly's novel of recovery and healing concludes with a reference to the Book of Ecclesiastes, familiar in its ethereal syllogism of opposites:

" A time to live and a time to die. A time to weep and a time to **heal**."

As Pope Francis said:

" ...modern prophets guiding and showing Jesus to others."

The immeasurable unseen.

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

As a priest, I'm amazed how happily married couples remember the tiniest details of their earliest encounters. They effortlessly report things like: "he wore a blue shirt," "we ordered brussels sprouts," "her hair was up in a bun," and "he spilled shrimp cocktail sauce at my family's open front door when it was ten degrees below zero," (that one's courtesy of my mom). We delight in remembering and speaking of when our new life of love began. The little details are glorious reminders that it's all *real*.

It's similar for John the Apostle. He tells us of the two disciples who followed Jesus into his house,

"...they stayed with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon."

Why does that tiny detail matter? Because that's the time of day when they encountered the love of Jesus the Messiah in their lives. Our religion is not primarily about abstract truths about God, no matter how true or sublime. It is about God meeting and saving us in our human nature. It's about a human relationship.

What was the time of day when you first recall encountering Christ and his Church? Who was there? What did you feel? How did things look and smell? What happened? Take some time to recall it in detail. For me, it was inside an old, rickety church on a hillside in Jerome, Arizona. It was about 9 p. m. on a Saturday evening. I was with my friends Jenny, Brad, and Laura. We were praying, singing, and laughing. When was it for you? Remembering the details isn't empty nostalgia.

It reminds us now that God's love for us in our humanity is real.


