

Topic: The Decades of Discipleship

On a chilly Saturday morning a man went out on his daily "rosary walk."

Q: Why would he do that?

A: The man acknowledged that while he was certainly unworthy and inadequate, nevertheless he could appreciate the solace, guidance and hopeful possibilities to be found amid the decades of those affirming, potentially transformative Marian prayers.

Every day he thought about and admired the amazing courage and fortitude of Mary's faithful actions. Saturday's *Joyful Mysteries,* as always, prompted meditative, critical self-discernment:

The Annunciation finds Mary, frightened and bewildered, yet trusting of God's plan.

By *The Visitation* Mary, again, moves in the spirit of God's plan. *The Nativity* with all its struggles and peril, fulfills the ancient prophecy.

Following the law, *The Presentation In The Temple* adheres once again to the ordered, guiding, clarifying divine plan.

The man could identify intellectually and viscerally, with *The Finding of Jesus In The Temple*. He could always feel the presence of Jesus during Mass at St. James.

He could find Jesus within the "temple" that is his own searching heart, and could often find Jesus reflected in the faces of the people he encountered each day. He, like Mary, could be frightened and bewildered by the vicissitudes of life yet he can appreciate the guidance, and the "second chances" found within the redemptive and hopeful compassion of the rosary.

Through the rosary, the unworthy can spiritually pivot to make rosary-inspired "course corrections" of faith and action. The bright star at the Nativity recalled in the rosary narrative still directs us in finding Jesus, in spite of the shadows of our own shortcomings, mistakes, regrets and failures.

The Catechism lauds the value of the Rosary. Pope John Paul II wrote that The Holy Rosary reveals the entire history of salvation, acts as a powerful weapon against evil, and is:



"...an effective means of obtaining true peace in our hearts."

The man walked on, following God's plan with hopeful prayer: *Hail Holy Queen, most gracious advocate..."*

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

We start telling lies around the age of three, the experts tell us. It's understandable. Lying is a god-like power. Whatever I want, I need only *say* it, and the world rearranges itself accordingly. It's amazing at first. But soon reality snaps back and I'm faced with a dilemma. If I remain committed to my lie I start to fracture into pieces. My words and reality drift apart, and I find myself lost in a lonely world of further falsehoods and fear of being found out.

How marvelous, then, that Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming: **"Repent!"** We tend to think it means "stop doing bad things" but it doesn't. It literally means "go beyond the mind you have." Think in a new way. It's painful to admit, but some portion of my mind is addicted to lie-telling, usually to protect my ego or make life easier. To repent means to admit this tendency, to say, "I'm done lying," and to move beyond my split mind into a complete commitment to the truth. Perhaps that's why at Mass we together proclaim, "I have sinned in my *thoughts*, and in my *words…*" Repentance and truth-telling work together.

Those who know the twelve-step process of addiction recovery know this process well. The fourth step requires radical truth-telling: listing our moral defects. This isn't being scrupulous. Rather it is freedom from falsehood, and entrance into the real world. This week, I invite you to join me in this practice. Get your phone or piece of paper. Answer the question: what are your true moral defects? Write them down. Remember, the Lord knows them already and loves you. We have a sacrament where this truth-telling is celebrated: Confession. Perhaps it is finally time to go beyond our childish lies.

Sacramental Confession

No sin is new to him. No wrongdoing too great. Come to Confession and experience mercy and joy. Confession is available Saturday from 4-5 pm in Church or by calling the office for an appointment.


