Pastor's Letter

The Lent Season

Ash Wednesday is Feb. 14th—Masses and distribution of ashes is at 8am, 12Noon, 4:15 and 7pm. It is a day of Fast and Abstinence as we begin our Lenten journey. Lent challenges us to pay more attention to what is happening in our heart and soul. We are called to focus seriously on our spiritual self, having

been reminded on Ash Wednesday that 'you are dust and unto dust you shall return' so we must 'turn away from sin and believe in the holy gospels'.

Guidelines for Lent: Abstinence

Catholics are called to abstain from eating meat every Friday during Lent. The obligation of **abstinence** (refraining from meat) begins at the age of 14. The obligation is 'in general', meaning that if for some good reason you are not able to abstain from meat on a particular Friday in Lent, you may choose to abstain on another day or perform some other act of penance or charity.

Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:30pm

Every Friday during Lent we will gather in the Church to journey with Christ in the Way of the Cross.

Reconciliation (Confession)

Whether you have been away for a long time or obtain these graces regularly, this will be one of the greatest blessings you'll receive while still on this earth. We'll be offering opportunities for Reconciliation every Saturday at 4 pm and special **Reconciliation Services the week of March 18th-21st.**

Give it up for Lent

Giving up something we like during Lent can be a reminder of the importance of sacrifice in our lives. Every time we refrain from eating candy, going shopping, watching television, drinking alcohol, or doing something else we enjoy, we have an opportunity to express our desire to love and draw near to God.

Do something positive

Lenten penance need not be only a question of abstaining from food or drink. Now is the time to begin or reinforce something positive in your life, like regular prayer or study and prayer with Scripture. Whenever our actions are intended to fulfill the Great Commandment of loving God and neighbor, they help us live as Christians and fulfill our baptismal call. Create time and space in your routine to draw closer to God.

Dear Friends and Families of Saint James,

Our next Children's Liturgy of the Word is this Sunday at the 10am Mass. We look forward to seeing our parish children there!

The Office of Religious Education is also preparing some unique opportunities for all of our parish families during Lent, which begins with **Ash Wednesday this week on February 14th**.

First, we have created a program called the **Lenten Family 40** to help your family celebrate the season of Lent. As a family, you are asked to complete at least 40 challenges together, from eating together at least four times a week to attending Stations of the Cross or our Lenten Family Day of Service. To participate, pick up a flyer in the vestibule of church or print a copy by going to the parish website. Details on the program and on how to register are on the flyer. Please note that registration is required <u>before</u> Ash Wednesday.

Second, we are hosting the parish's Stations of the Cross on Friday, February 23, at 7:30pm in the church. All parishioners are welcome to join us as our families and Catechists help lead the Stations.

Next, we will host a **Lenten Family Day of Service** open to all parish families on Saturday, March 2nd, from 12:30-2:30 in Kavanagh Hall. We will assist the parish Feed the Needy Program by donating needed items, cleaning, organizing supplies, and writing cards to go into the lunches for the needy.

We also will host **Holy Pause**, an opportunity for families to reset this Lent. All parish families are invited to stop by Kavanagh Hall anytime between 9am and Noon on Sunday, March 10th. Along with Coffee and Donuts, we will have experiential stations where you can pray, create a small craft project to take home, and complete a service opportunity at your own pace. We hope you will join us for a fun, hands-on, and meaningful event to help deepen your family's Lenten journey.

Families in Religious Education, please remember that we are hosting the 4:15pm Mass on Ash Wednesday. For families with children in Traditional

Faith Formation, children should check in with their Catechist when they arrive; then, the children can sit with their class or with their families. For families in Family Faith Formation, we will have a check in sheet available near the choir.





Catholic Q & A

J.P. Alegria

Topic: A Clean Heart. O God.

Q: Why is the Fourth Sunday of Lent called Laetare Sunday?

A: The Latin word, Laetare, (pronounced "lay-tah-re" means "rejoice." Catholic scholarship directs us to the Fourth Sunday Entrance Antiphon or Introit (entrance), with its opening hymn text:

"Rejoice, O Jerusalem..."

That Sunday is said to

"...express hope and joy in the midst of fasts and penances...giving us a glimpse of the joy to come at Easter."

In a bit of a faith parallel we recall that the third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday (pronounced in three syllables, gow-deh-tay), is somewhat similar in spirit to Laetare in its aspects of anticipatory faith. James-Charles Noonan, Jr, writes in *The Church Visible*:

"Gaudete means expressed or **exuberant joy**. Laetare means **internal joy**, a joy of anticipation felt within the solemn session of Lent."

The Catechism, in Paragraph 1095, talks about Advent, Lent, and the Easter Vigil as times to re-read and re-live "the great events of salvation history."

The Catechism underscores that those events remain a living part of "the today" of the Church's liturgy; that the Church's liturgy not only reveals salvation, "it enables us to live it."

Latin translations and pronunciations aside, it is instructive and clarifying to remember Pope St. John Paul II:

"Lent...detaches us from our selfishness...meanness, and pride. Lent is a time to put life back in its proper place and remember two things about ourselves:

> we came from God, and we are journeying back to Him..."

Pope Benedict XVI wrote:

"...the Lenten Season offers us once again an opportunity to reflect upon the very heart of Christian life: *charity...walking together in holiness.*"

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

Recently I had a skin rash, and it was awful.

(Please don't tell anyone.) I am embarrassed to admit that I didn't handle it well. Complaining, whining, begging for sympathy, and crying were my responses to the merciless itching and burning. In the aftermath, a silver lining emerged. I feel a new heartfelt sympathy for all those vexed with chronic skin problems. If you've ever had a seemingly unending skin problem, you know how that sympathy flows up from deep inside.

This gut-level compassion is something like what the Gospel describes in Jesus when the sore-covered leper says, **'If you will it, you can make me clean.**" At this, just before the healing, Jesus was **'moved with compassion.**"

The Greek word used here is strong and earthy, closer to

"his bowels and guts trembled with the deepest emotions of sadness, pity, and love."

In Jesus, God heals our infirmities not from a divine distance but by learning what it *feels like* to be us. He acquires first-hand experience of what it costs us to be afflicted and still be faithful to God. He sympathizes with the burning, itching, and blistering of human existence in the deepest, first-hand way. To discover that is to touch Jesus' heart.

What in your life, right now, is breaking out like diseased skin? What is getting worse the more you try to soothe it? Perhaps only you feel it. Or maybe it's exposed to all. A bad habit, broken relationship, loneliness, fear of failure, self-hatred? Name it, and then find a way to bring it confidently to Jesus who will *feel what we are feeling,* and thereby heal us.
