Pastor's Letter

Guidelines for Lent:

Abstinence

Catholics are called to abstain from eating meat every Friday during Lent. The obligation of **abstinence** (refraining from meat) begins at the age of 14. The obligation is 'in general', meaning that if for some good reason you are not able to abstain from meat on a particular Friday in Lent, you may choose to abstain on another day or perform some other act of penance or charity.

Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:30pm

Every Friday during Lent we will gather in the Church to journey with Christ in the Way of the Cross.

Reconciliation (Confession)

Whether you have been away for a long time or obtain these graces regularly, this will be one of the greatest blessings you'll receive while still on this earth. We'll be offering opportunities for Reconciliation every Saturday at 4 pm and special **Reconciliation Services the week of March 18th-21st**.

Give it up for Lent

Giving up something we like during Lent can be a reminder of the importance of sacrifice in our lives. Every time we refrain from eating candy, going shopping, watching television, drinking alcohol, or doing something else we enjoy, we have an opportunity to express our desire to love and draw near to God.

Do something positive

Lenten penance need not be only a question of abstaining from food or drink. Now is the time to begin or reinforce something positive in your life, like regular prayer or study and prayer with Scripture. Whenever our actions are intended to fulfill the Great Commandment of loving God and neighbor, they help us live as Christians and fulfill our baptismal call. Create time and space in your routine to draw closer to God.

Lent is all about preparation: prayer, fasting, good works. A short daily reflection can be sent to your email box containing daily scripture and context and thoughts.

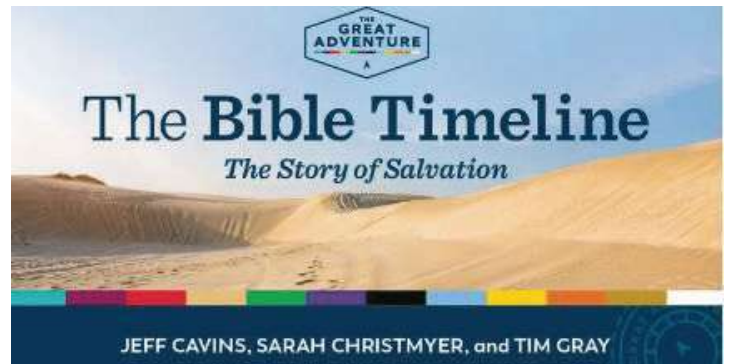

It's normal to grieve a pregnancy loss, including the loss of a child by abortion.

It can form a hole in one's heart, a hole so deep that sometimes it seems nothing can fill the emptiness. You are not alone... **hopeafterabortion.com/**

When I feel down, I sometimes watch the famous “Double Rainbow” video on YouTube to feel better.

It’s hilarious. A young man camping in Yosemite Park sees two rainbows stretching across the sky. He bursts into a kind of ecstasy.

“Double rainbow, all the way! Oh my God!” he announces. Then he starts to weep. He cries out, “What does it *mean*?”

Beneath the humor of his glorious overreaction is the deep intuition we all have, I think, when we see the colorful bow in the sky.



This Sunday, God sends a rainbow to Noah, and to us. What *does* it mean?

Long before YouTube had the double rainbow, Dante’s medieval poem *The Divine Comedy* featured one in his image of paradise. Seeing two rainbows, he muses that one is born of the other. The bow is God’s promise of peace. For Dante, it’s even more: nature’s encrypted image of the Trinitarian God. One visible rainbow (God the Son) is begotten of another usually invisible one (God the Father) united by invisible light between them (God the Spirit). Like invisible light, Trinitarian glory surrounds us in every moment — but Jesus has made it visible in his glorious body.

Lenten challenge: This might seem silly, but this Lent I invite you to find a rainbow and meditate on it. You might have to make one yourself, like this current desert-dweller will. Gaze on it. See there a natural gift from the Creator, saying to you, “Here I am! I will love and protect you, surrounding you in My glory.” This Lent let’s embrace that with confidence, rain, or shine.

Topic: Humble, Sacrificial Service

Matthew 1:19 describes him as a just man, a righteous man; virtuous in all things.

Q: Who is he?

A: *St. Joseph*

- Pope Francis said we must imitate this man's virtues; virtues practiced daily in his quiet way.
- He is described as staunchly obedient to God's will.
- He is known as a noble, selfless, faithful leader by example.
- He is celebrated as a determined hard-worker.
- Even in his silence he was a teacher, and a chaste and strengthening exemplar of the family unit.
- St. John Chrysostom marked St. Joseph "...at the service of the entire plan of salvation."
- Joseph, and all the saints offer "proof that it is possible to put the Gospel into practice."
- Pope Francis again reminds that "amid the tempests of life, we must never be afraid to let the Lord steer the course."

The Feast of the Solemnity of Saint Joseph is celebrated on March 19th.

St. Joseph is cited as patron of the Universal Church, of unborn children, fathers, workers, travelers, immigrants, and a patron of the dying.

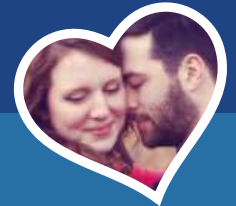

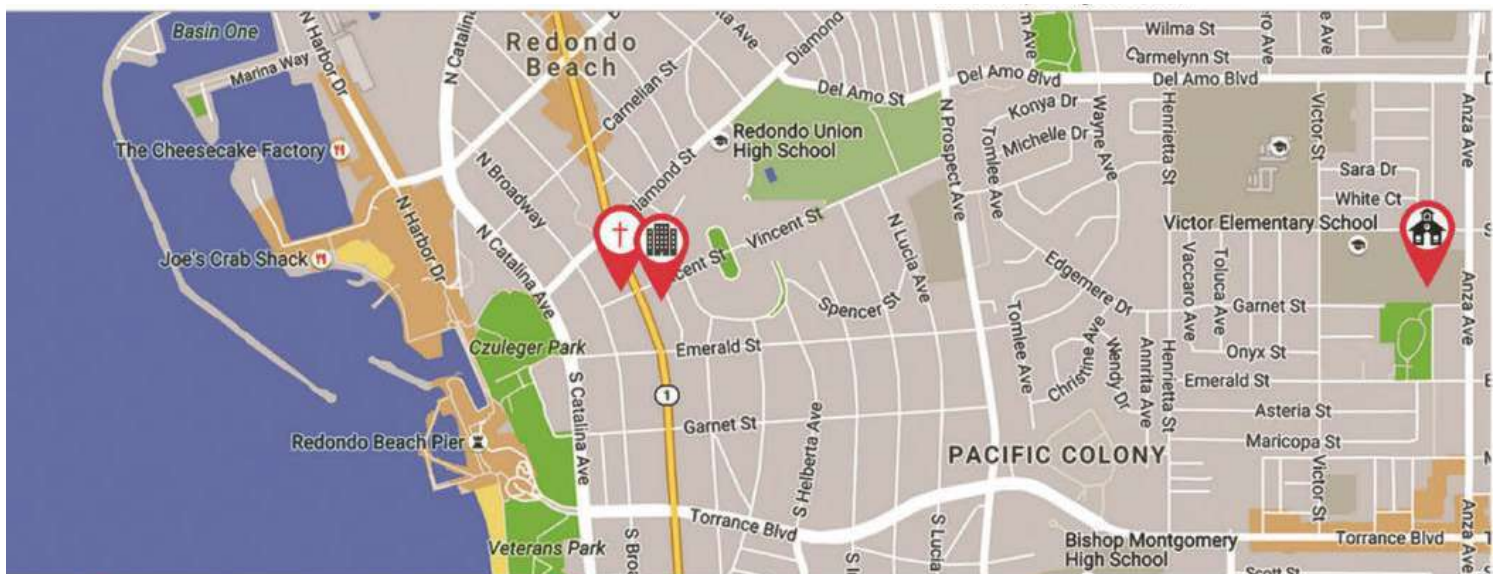
