Pastor's Letter

New Property and Preschool Update

One of the concerns that we have had in planning to move the Parish Center to our new property is how to design the Preschool into the facility as the preschool requires a lot of dedicated space. Building the Preschool on this site would have meant closing the Preschool for several years until the new Parish Center construction was completed. We have always known that the most effective place for the preschool is on the campus of our elementary school but there is no room to add an extra building and playground.

During these last few months working with Danina Uy, the school principal and Wendy Bell, the Preschool Director we have realized that the current before/after school care program room in the O'Gorman Center is perfectly designed for transformation into a preschool. This is a very exciting opportunity! Bringing the preschool onto the school campus truly unites our Catholic educational programs for our children and enables our families to participate more fully.


Since October 1st we have been working with advisors, architects, contractors and the Archdiocese to determine the best layout and design of the space. We believe that we are nearing the point where we can begin the actual architectural drawings needed to present for permitting the work to be done. The new facility will be designed to accommodate two classrooms for children who are 2.5 up to 4 years old. There will be an outdoor play space, bathrooms situated inside the classrooms, and an outdoor patio space for lunch.

We anticipate that escrow will close on the sale of our present Parish Center at the end of 2024. With that in mind, the Fall 2024 program for the preschool would continue at its present location and then move to the new facilities at the school after Christmas.

Shining Stars in Christ Honoree Kevin Babuder



Q: We know you and appreciate you as an Educator, Administrator, Accomplished Musician, Published Composer, Director of Choirs, and Family Man. Is it true that you also played the Bassoon, that doublereeded instrument considered one of the most difficult orchestral wind instruments to learn? Can you tell us what role the

Bassoon "played" in your life?

A: Yes, indeed. I had the privilege of being a professional bassoonist in a symphony orchestra in Miami, Florida, for six seasons. Working alongside talented musicians in an environment that demanded precision and attention to detail greatly influenced my development as a conductor, arranger, and musician.

Q: What do you see as the role and the future of spiritual music in the Mass?

A: As music ministers, our role within the Mass is pivotal both now and in the future. We serve by enriching the liturgy with song and music, enhancing the worship experience, and fostering a deeper connection to the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Moreover, through our music, we echo and reinforce the messages conveyed in the Scripture readings, encouraging active participation and engagement among the faithful. The profound impact that our music has on individuals, as evidenced by their expressions of gratitude, reflects the presence of the divine spirit within our communal worship.

Q: How would you describe St. James Parish? **A:** St. James Parish is a vibrant and welcoming community that embodies kindness, thoughtfulness, and encouragement. Visitors consistently remark on the warmth they experience here. It's not just a place of worship; it's a sanctuary where life's milestones are celebrated and shared. 



Why Fast?

"God commanded it, Jesus practiced it, the Church fathers have preached the importance of it — fasting is a powerful and fundamental part of the Christian life."

Fasting, at its root, is a spiritual exercise.

When we fast our body feels weak. We come face to face with our humanity and are humbled.

When we take away what our body wants, it quiets down.

Our souls become stronger and prayer becomes more powerful.

It is a transformative experience and a powerful spiritual weapon that helps order our flesh that tries to control us.

Fasting is a great way to practice self-control and progress in our spiritual lives.

St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the greatest Catholic theologians to ever live said that we fast for three reasons.

"For we fast for three purposes:

- 1. to restrain the desires of the flesh;
- 2. to raise the mind to contemplate sublime things;
- 3. to make satisfaction for our sins.

These are good and noble things, and so fasting is virtuous." — *St. Thomas Aquinas*

Gospel Meditation— Father John Muir

As a college student, my prized possession was an after -market car stereo. It was my pride and joy: glorious audio, eye-catching display screen, and multi-disc CD changer. It drained my hard-earned dollars, but it was totally worth it. It drenched me in music everywhere I drove. On Ash Wednesday of my senior year of college, Father Tom, the Jesuit priest at my university said, "Pray for God to tell you what he wants you to sacrifice for Lent." I did. In my heart, the answer came: "Give up listening to your car stereo for forty days." I winced. Not possible, I thought. Can't do it. I made other plans. The next morning, I was stunned to find that my car had been broken into, and my fancy stereo ripped out and stolen.

God's command to sacrifice what we love is no joke. This week in Genesis 22, God says: "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, whom you love — Isaac — and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you." Believe me, I know. We like to be in control. It chaffs us that *God sets the terms* of what we must sacrifice, and how. But this is no impersonal, tyrannical process. Remember that God uses their names, Abraham and Isaac. God knows each one of us and the precious gifts He commands us to offer. Finally, our sacrifices are for our own good. Do we trust this enough to do what Father Tom asked me to do?

Lenten challenge: This week, I dare you to ask God: "What do you want me to give up?" He may ask for that which you love most. It will be something precious to you: time, money, a relationship, a dream, an opportunity. What matters is we trust Him and act sacrificially in line with His command. Whatever we sacrifice will of course come back to us as surely as the Risen Jesus but that doesn't make it easy.

Catholic Q & A J.P. Alegria

Topic: Walk With Him

There is a beautifully contemplative, prayerful Catholic devotional observance which the Catholic News Agency describes, among other things, as an important "catechetical tool." Scholars say that this devotional observance originated during the Crusades when knights and pilgrims began to follow the route of Christ's way to Calvary. This devotion spread throughout Europe, promulgated by Franciscan Friars in the 14th and 15th centuries.

Q: What is this venerable devotion that Catholics take up faithfully once again during the Season Of Lent? *A:* It's **The Stations Of The Cross.**

Pope Francis recognized the stations as gestures of devotion at a time when,"...we look at Jesus walking by and walk with him. The Cross is a call to Love." In a 14th Century renaissance painting by Raphael,(or possibly done by his students), the "Vision of the Cross" depicts a premonition that the Roman Emperor Constantine had before the Battle of Milvian Bridge where he defeated his rival Maxentius in the 2nd century. Constantine saw the Greek words on one side of the cross which said: "By this, conquer." Scholars relate those words in Latin: *in hoc signo,* translated as "By this sign thou shalt conquer."


We know that Constantine's Mother, the Roman Empress St. Helena, or Helen was a zealous advocate of the Cross and its spiritual and historical place in history through the ages.

In our own time, beyond transformative visions and holy relics, here at St. James we have the stations beautifully and permanently presented above and along our church nave, observed and prayed throughout the year and now prominently and lovingly celebrated, especially during the Fridays of Lent.

Our Choir sings about the "Via Dolorosa; called the way of suffering."


