





Why Go to Confession This Lent

Lent is the time of year when God obligates us to prepare our hearts and to purify our souls so that we are ready to receive Our Lord in His glorious coming at Easter. There's no time to delay.

The Bible says, "Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:2).

During this season, every day we should try to make a good examination of conscience by asking ourselves these questions:

- Is there something I can do to get closer to God?
- Is there something I can do to know God better and to love Him more?
- Is there some way I can increase my desire for prayer?
- Is there some way I can rekindle that fire of divine love that might have gone out in my life?
- Is there some way I can rid myself of the spiritual mediocrity, the spiritual indifference that I find myself in so much of the time?
- Is there something I can give up?
- Is there something in my life right now that is not pleasing to Almighty God?
- Is there some sin that I am holding on to?
- Is there some habitual sin that is separating my heart from God's loving grace?
- Is there something I need to confess?
- Am I crucifying Our Lord all over again by living in my sins?

Further, we should pray every day:

Lord, let there be less of me and more of You. Let me say no to my will and yes to Yours. God, give me the grace to love You more today than yesterday and more tomorrow than today.

The Fatima seer Jacinta spoke this challenging truth: "If men only knew what eternity is, how they would make all possible efforts to amend their lives."

With this in mind, let us explore the special grace God gives us in the sacrament of Confession to help us on that journey of sanctification.

I am the Lord your God ... You shall not have other gods beside me. -Ex 20:2-3

One of the greatest golfers of all time — if not the greatest — was Jack Nicklaus. Which is why it is baffling that at the beginning of each season he would

return to his childhood coach and re-learn how to grip the golf club. It's like Shakespeare re-learning the alphabet and grammar. Why would he do that? Because Jack knew that the fundamentals are always relevant. Perfecting and obsessing over his grip allowed him to do everything else in the game well. In sports and life, the best ones love the basics.



Similarly, as we begin Lent, we re-learn the spiritual basics in the Ten Commandments. Consider the first, to "have no other gods besides me." This is our "grip." Is our connection to God one of absolute fidelity and exclusive worship? Am I willing to let go of my precious idols, the things I cling to instead of God? Once we say "yes" to this fundamental question of our spiritual "grip," then we are ready to properly engage with everything else in life. Watch how beautifully the game of life unfolds in the next nine commandments (numbered in parentheses): how we speak to God and others (2 and 8), how we organize our week (3), how we relate to our family (4) and the wider community (5 and 7), how we live our sexuality (6), and how we order all the other desires of the human heart (9 and 10). But don't rush to these later Commandments too soon! Everything in life is built on the first Commandment. The more we focus on worshiping God alone, the better we navigate the complexity of life with panache, effectiveness, and love.

Lenten challenge: This week, identify what you can do to better worship God alone. If you're not sure, scan the last nine commandments to identify what you are most likely to worship instead of God. Power, pleasure, control of your time, possessions, family, health, reputation, money?

Commit to concrete action to help you let go of this "idol" to better hold on to God alone in faithful worship. Remember: the best love the basics.

Topic: Seek the Lord

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops marks Lent as a 40 day season of *prayer*, *fasting*, and *almsgiving*, writing, *"We seek the Lord in prayer..."*We are seekers, as in the mode of Philippians 3:14 -

"I press on toward the goal, toward the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus."


Writer Henri Nouwen, described as "...one of the most innovative and influential spiritual writers of the past century," wrote thirty-nine books about the spiritual life. Along this particular theme of Lenten devotion, Nouwen wrote in splendidly dynamic, goal-oriented terms:

"Our Lenten journey informs our movement toward the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus."

In a recent Homily, Monsignor Mike talked about encountering Christ in each other. Nouwen writes: "We see Christ in the Scriptures...seeing him, we follow him and discover Christ in one another."

Q: The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes the many forms of prayer. Is there a particular set of prayers that could serve to make especially reverent each day of the Lenten journey?

A: Yes. The Bishops describe a set of prayers which were originally prayed in Latin, morning, noon, and evening in honor of the Incarnation. The brief devotion of *The Angelus*, deriving its name from the opening phrase, *Angelus Domini nuntiavit Mariae* (the Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary.), echoes the clerical praying of the Liturgy of the Hours. It's a triple recitation of the Hail Mary and short verses from the Bible. *Ave Maria Press* states that, "Praying the Angelus sanctifies the hours of the day. God is our all, our very beginning and the end toward which we strive." Amid this Lenten journey, calling us to prayer, the Angelus bells toll in our ears and within our searching hearts. (Our church bells play the Angelus at noon and 6 pm.—Ed.)


