Pastor's Letter

Hello Beautiful Children of God!

As we come to the end of the Liturgical Year with the Feast of Christ the King, I thought it would be appropriate to share with you an excerpt from Chris Stefanick's series, *The Search*. Stefanick is one of the more prominent voices in Catholicism today, and the transcript I share with you is a video that spoke to my soul:

"Christ the King—we trust in you. Jesus Christ is a King.

The Jews weren't waiting for some Hippie to come along, or somebody who would be their buddy or homeboy. They were waiting for a king to come and rule the nations and establish peace and justice on the earth.

When he was born the three Magi - the wise men - came looking for him, they were looking for the King of the Jews. When he stood before Pontius Pilate he said you're right in saying I am a king. When he started his ministry he announced the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand. He talked about the final judgment where he would sit over all the world over all the nations and judge them as king. When he hung on the cross "King of the Jews" hung over his head. And the Good thief next to him said "Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom." And he said I promise you today you will be with me in paradise.

But this wasn't like any other king. He wasn't born in a palace, he was born in a manger. He lived his whole life in poverty. Instead of trying to acquire more and more wealth and power he renounced it every chance that he got. He didn't wear a crown of gold, he wore a crown made of thorns. He was lifted high above the world but it was in a cross, blessing and forgiving those who killed him.

But make no mistake about it, he is a king. And a king has a kingdom and a kingdom has boundaries. He invites us to accept his reign over our minds and hearts and wills and lives.

See having a king means you're not the king, I'm not the king. It means we don't do religion on our terms but on his. We can't be cafeteria Catholics picking and choosing the doctrines that we follow...picking and choosing our commandments that we want - chucking out the rest. We don't set the terms of our faith, we receive it.

Jesus Christ is the king. The fact that he's a king means he reigns over our hearts and minds which means that our faith has implications in our lives that stretch way beyond what happens in Church on the pew every Sunday. The fact that he's my king means I'm called to serve. He washed his apostle's feet and he told them "you call me lord and master". Look what I'm doing.

If you call me Lord and Master, this is how you're supposed to serve other people.

Look I know it might be scary this whole idea of having a king. In fact, kingdoms of this world have gone out style because a lot of kings have violated people's freedom in establishing their kingdoms and their power. But Jesus is unlike any other king. He's a king who guarantees our freedom. Here's a king who makes us free from sin, free from self-centeredness, free even from death, free from the reign of this world. This is a king who invites us not just to be subjects, but who raises us up and makes us heirs, heirs of far more than kingdoms of brick and

Jesus Christ is a king. Is he YOUR king?" God bless.





Order Out of Chaos

Working in the home garden, frustrated by geraniums which were doing poorly and wondering about soil amending while fighting the grasshoppers, scripture came to mind:

"The Lord God planted a garden in Eden..."

Q: What can be said about garden settings in the Bible as metaphors of God's plan, as practical settings, as tests of faith, and as lessons of hierarchical order, spiritual direction, death and renewal?

A: "And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day."

Biblical scholars describe approximately 60 scriptural entries about gardens. Among them is John 15:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener."

We, as followers of Christ, are indeed the branches. pruned and cultivated among the gardens and vineyards of faith across the ages, from Eden to the Mount of Olives and Gethsemane.

St. Francis, Patron Saint of the environment nurtured and valued the fruits of the earth. The mystical Catherine of Siena, spoke about faith as a sort of 'tree' of virtue.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops spoke on this theme of gardens and the foundational aspects of cultivating harvests of faith:

"We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation."

Back to the geraniums, we're working on our faith amid the gardens of this life. We read in *The Catechism*:

"...God places him in the garden. There he lives to till it and keep it."

Gospel Meditation — Father John Muir

When I was a young boy in Burlington, Vermont, my dad had a good friend named Phil who owned a sporting goods store. I loved sports, so meandering the treasure-filled aisles was an unmitigated joy. One afternoon, we were shopping for a baseball glove. Dad said to me, "Hey Johnny, see that man who just walked into the store? *That's* Phil." I remember being fascinated and a little terrified. I recall thinking, "That man right there is in charge of *everything* in this store!" He reigned over every ball, sneaker, jersey, and sweat suit. Phil became a family friend. And he was a good owner. The store flourished, and I found myself even more at peace every time I went there. I felt a new hope and even responsibility for the store to flourish.

To say that Christ is the King of the Universe means that Jesus has absolute authority over everything in it. It should fill us with awe and fascination. He is in charge. The world and everything in it are finally his. Knowing that he knows and loves us should make us also feel a deep peace at being a part of his universe. This leads us to want his kingdom to flourish, to play some responsible role in it.

We advance his kingdom by promoting the truth. "Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice," Christ the King proclaims. In Phil's store, it was about the truth of athletics. In our world, it's all about the truth of all creation, especially the dignity of the human person, made by and for our loving God. Let's rejoice that we know the true king and commit to the flourishing of his kingdom.
