PASTOR'S CORNER

Hello beautiful children of God!

In our Gospel this week, Jesus asks his disciples if a "blind person can lead a blind person." The answer is no, as Jesus adds, because both will fall into the pit from a lack of vision. And so it is with the life of discipleship. How can we lead others to Christ if we don't know Him ourselves? How can we pass on the faith to our children if we're not taking the proper steps to nurture relationship with Jesus through a life of sacraments and prayer? Children mimic what they see.

I am thankful for parents who nurtured faith in my heart by example. I constantly witnessed my mother praying the Rosary. My father was always helping others in a life of service. And together, they made sure their boys attended weekly Mass and were educated in Catholic schools. Although I rebelled in my teenage years and walked away from the Catholic faith for the next 20 years, I knew the road home when the treasures of this world failed to fulfill my deepest longing, which can only be filled by Jesus.

Our role as disciples is to live out the faith in our daily lives to provide a witness to the love of Christ – to lead others, especially those entrusted to our care, through a virtuous life. What are we portraying to the world through our speech and actions? If people spent time in your presence, would they recognize that Jesus is the center of your life, that He is your Lord? This is something to ponder in our Lenten journey.

LENT: THE INTERIOR PILGRIMAGE

The National Catholic Register, reporting on Lent, writes in viscerally heartfelt terms about some of the contemplative and dynamic dimensions of our faith. The register talks about "giving yourself to others in loving service" and "seeking the gaze of Christ in the faces that surround us."

We know that the scriptures and the liturgy often strike mystic chords of personally emotional and often motivational faith tones. We also know the Lenten Season as a profoundly connective mix of holy stillness and watchfulness while at the same time an amalgam of internally active, forward-looking faith.

Q: What are some additional examples of the spiritual dimensions that place us closer to Jesus?

A: Mark's Gospel is particularly noted for the vividly detailed events in the ministry of Jesus. Reading Mark's Gospel engenders and inspires discernment and appreciation of the divine and the human interactions on those long ago dusty roads, teeming cities and isolated villages where the savior walked.

Mark describes Jesus angrily addressing his detractors as he heals the man with the withered hand, and we're there when Jesus "*sighs deeply*", or when he is emotionally distressed at the masses who are like lost sheep without direction or food. He feels merciful, therefore his will is that the leper be made clean. We can contemplate the reactions and the actions of the divine and the human messiah; we can almost discern the very gaze of Jesus in these events.

In the contemplative, deeply emotional season of Lent there are the words of Pope Benedict XVI who wrote about getting closer to Jesus:

"When a person is conquered by the fire of his gaze, no sacrifice seems too great to follow him and give him the best of ourselves...Lent is a time of interior pilgrimage towards him...with faith, penance, prayer, almsgiving...able to celebrate Easter in truth...renewing the promises of our Baptism."

GOSPEL MEDITATION

One of the things that older pastors and younger priests occasionally quarrel about is the proper balance between work and prayer. I know one pastor who complains that his younger associate ignores the people and the parish because he wants to spend more time in prayer. And the young priest complains that the pastor gives him too much work to do and no time to pray. The Lord's words this Sunday speak into this tension with an image that can help us find a proper balance between life and prayer.

Jesus says, "**For every tree is known by its fruit. For people do not pick figs from thorn bushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles**" (Luke 6:44). When we are deeply rooted and cultivating our relationship with Jesus, we are going to bear the fruit of that love in our lives. No fruit, no good prayer. How do we know that we are praying well? We are experiencing concrete fruits of love for others in our lives.

Someone who prays well will, sooner or later, burst forth the "figs" and "grapes" of acts of love. But without concrete commitment to deeds of selfless service to others, our prayer time is as useless as thorn bushes and brambles. Let's recommit ourselves to be men and women of prayer *and* service. And hopefully the pastors will help their associates to pray *and* serve fruitfully... with minimal quarreling. - **Father John Muir** ©LPI

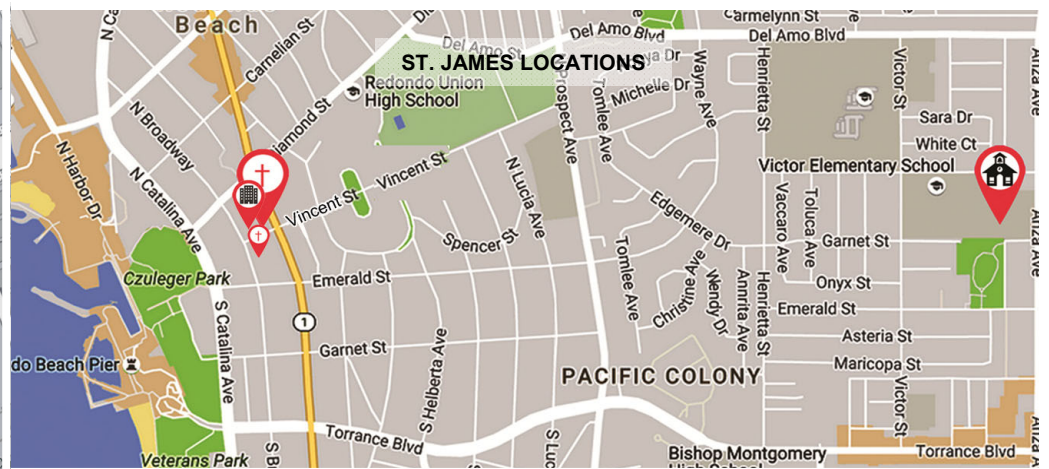
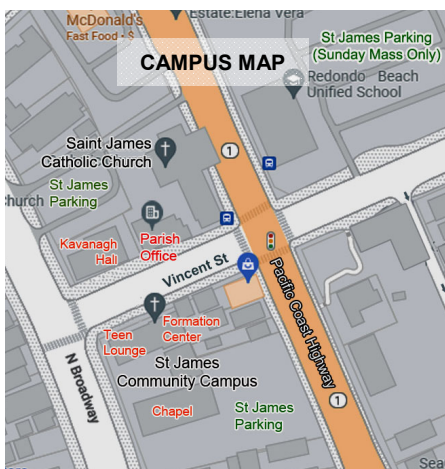
