PASTOR'S CORNER

Hello beautiful children of God!

Our Lenten journey has begun, and in the wisdom of the Church, we're asked to engage more intentionally in the spiritual practices – prayer, fasting, and almsgiving – during this solemn season. Rather than “giving something up,” it might be a more fulfilling journey to add something of a spiritual nature to grow as a disciple of Jesus.

Brian Mercier, a Catholic influencer on YouTube, posted a video on his *Catholic Truth* channel which made some wonderful suggestions on how to make the most of our Lenten journey. He provided six examples (actually seven, but I condensed two into one practice) to help us come out of our forty days in the desert as a new creation.

The Spiritual Exercises of St Ignatius: A number of books exist that help lead us through the spiritual exercises. Set time aside each day to contemplate Scripture in a more personal way.

Spiritual reading: Grab a spiritual classic, read it slowly, and stop when the written word inspires deeper contemplation. Brian makes the suggestion of two incredible works, *The Imitation of Christ* by Thomas a Kempis and *Introduction to the Devout Life* by St Francis de Sales. I've used these two books during Lent before and found them very enriching.

Liturgy of the Hours: This is the daily prayer of the church which marks the “hours” of the day – morning, daytime, evening, and nighttime. If you'd like to learn how to pray with the church, you can download the *iBreviary* app from the Apple Store.

Overcome sin: If you prefer to “give something up,” try to work with God's grace to overcome a repetitive sin. Seek forgiveness in the sacrament of Reconciliation, place the sin at the foot of the Cross when you come forward to receive Communion, and pray for God's grace to be at work in your life when temptation sets in.

Silence: “Be still and know that I am God” (Psalm 46:11). Take time each day to enter into the silence and listen to the still, small voice of God. Brian suggests that we sit for 5 minutes a day for the first week and then add 5 minutes a day in each successive week. By the end of Lent, we will have built up to 30 glorious minutes of silence with God per day. This is a life-changer!

Read the Bible: In the same fashion as spiritual reading, the Bible should be read in small segments – one chapter at a time. When God speaks to the heart through His Sacred Word, stop and reflect on the word or phrase that caused your heart to ponder.

I hope that these recommendations help make this Lent the best Lent ever for you. Please know of my prayers for your Lenten journey.

CATHOLIC Q & A

J.P. ALEGRIA

LENT: A MEASURE OF HOLINESS & PERFECTION

The Book of Sirach teaches that "The word of God on high is the fountain of wisdom."

Scholars say that Sirach was an author and sage who presented moral teaching to catechumens and to the faithful whereby they would maintain religious faith and integrity. Sometimes that integrity of faith can be quite challenging to the very real ethos or spirit within contemporary daily life. In 1 Thessalonians we are called to perfection and holiness, and again we find that same call in the Gospel of Matthew, The Book of Leviticus, and 1 St.Peter.

Sunday's Gospel of Luke 6 raised the faith bar once again in calling on the faithful to "love your enemies...do good to those who hate you." That posture of love and goodness given those circumstances is also not so easy to measure out. We may be more in line with the father of the tormented son in Mark 9, who when Jesus inquired of his faith responded, "Help my unbelief!"

Q: What pastoral teaching did Pastor Matt offer as guidance for those seeking a measure of holiness?

A: Father gave us faithful food for thought in his homily, acknowledging firstly that holiness and perfection are starkly formidable aspirations. He reminded us of the word of God on high, part of that Catholic fountain of wisdom wherein we may apply the spiritual tools with which we can move toward a more perfect faith. Those "tools" that Father talked about, upon which we must rely along a journey toward holiness include:

Prayer, Grace, the Sacraments, and the virtue that David showed Saul in Sunday's First Reading - Mercy.

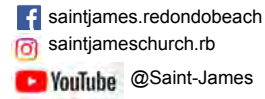

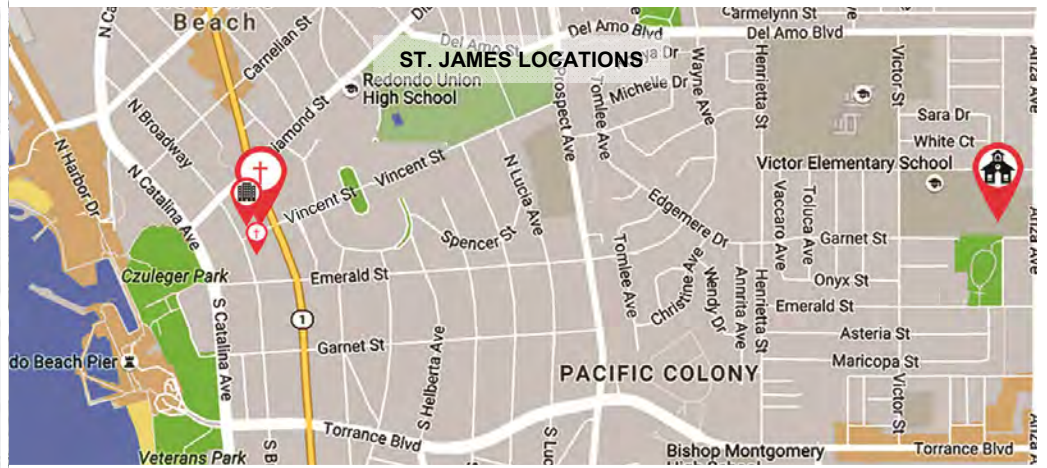
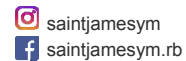
