## PASTOR'S CORNER

### Hello beautiful children of God!

In our Gospel for this Sixth Week of Easter (*Jn 14:23–29*), Jesus is sitting with His disciples, pouring out His heart before going to the Cross, and what does He says here? It is significant!

*"If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him."* 

Let that sink in. God wants to make His HOME in you. Not just check in on Sundays. Not just swing by when you're in a spiritual emergency. He wants to *live* in you. How incredible is that?

This isn't some abstract spirituality. This is real intimacy with the God of the universe. And it starts with love—and love looks like obedience. That's not a word we like, but Jesus makes it clear: Love and obedience go together. Not because He's bossy, but because He's a good Father who knows how life works best.

Now here's the part that hits me hard:

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you."

We live in a world that defines peace as "no conflict," "no stress," or "finally made enough money to chill." But let's be honest, that kind of peace is fragile. It falls apart when your plans do. Jesus offers something deeper: a peace that remains, even in chaos.

This is the kind of peace that let the early Christians sing in prison. The kind that lets moms and dads keep loving their families when life is nuts. The kind of peace that doesn't depend on your circumstances, but rather, on His presence.

And here's the kicker:

"Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."

You hear that? He's not saying, "Try not to worry." He's commanding us: "Don't let it in." Why? Because we've got the Holy Spirit—the Advocate, the Comforter. You are not alone.

So today, let's stop chasing the world's version of peace. Let's let Jesus move in, make His home in us, and live in the deep, unshakable peace only He can give.

Live in faith and not in fear. And remember—you were made for this.





### Age-appropriate curiosity in school-aged children

Last week, we covered young children and natural curiosity about their bodies. This week, we will explore natural curiosity behaviors in school-aged children (around 7-12 years old). It's important to understand the difference between appropriate and inappropriate, as inappropriate behaviors could a sign of abuse. Common curiosity at this

age includes playing games with same-aged friends like "family" or "dating," or wanting privacy. Children at these ages may also begin to take an interest in members of the opposite sex and ask questions about relationships. ### CONCORDANCE OF FAITH

A penitent spoke to his Priest about once again coming up a little short along the spiritual continuum of love of neighbor, despite knowing the Ten Commandments and John 13, with the part about the "new commandment" to love thy neighbor in order to be more readily recognized as a Christian.

The Priest once again reminded him to patiently and empathetically consider the foibles, frailties, and challenges faced by those "neighbors" he encountered daily in order to see both sides, in the spirit of the "new commandment."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church #1450-1451 instructs: " Penance requires the sinner to endure all things willingly, be contrite of heart...practice complete humility ...together with the resolution not to sin again."

The National Catholic Register helps to stabilize and clarify the framework of an elevated confession space by way of a series of brass-tack, bottom-line confessionguide questions as part of a solid framework of spiritual reference. Here follows just a few of those questions:

**Q:** Do I give God time every day in prayer; do I love Him with my whole heart?

**A**:

**Q:** Do I seek to surrender myself to God's word as taught by the Church?

**Q:** Do I speak badly of others...am I sincere...[or] critical, negative, or uncharitable...

Now, a portion of a prayer before confession:

"O most merciful God, I sincerely desire to leave all my evil ways...give me a lively faith and a firm hope in the Passion of my Redeemer..."

Pope Leo, in his opening address, reminded us of God's love for us. Now we are reminded by the catechism about a spirit of humility, with a contrite heart, that it is incumbent upon us to love God... and one another.

Avoiding the near occasion of sin... now that's a genuine and lively faith.
